Last Term...

The term running up to Easter was remarkably busy with so many opportunities for learning and events that helped us strengthen ties to our fantastic and supportive community. We had the chance to officially thank Laurencekirk Vehicle Parade Organisers for their very generous donation of £603 that was raised in December. A representative gave the pupils a cheque and we gave them a life sized "Thank You Tractor" that the artistic minds in P5/6 created.



Way back in January, we held the annual Scots Poetry competition to celebrate the Bard's birthday. We were so impressed by the standard of recital and we are very proud of our winners, and every child who took the time to learn a poem and find the confidence to share it in school – not an easy thing to do! Our Burns assembly was a celebration of Scotland with dancers, violins, singing, recitals and the presentation of awards.

We continued with the Scottish theme on our Burns Haggis Drive and Ceilidh which was organised and run by the Glenbervie School Partnership (GSP). What a brilliant night of food and entertainment! Definitely one of the highlights of the year so far!

With the lack of Seesaw, the school has been open more to try to give parents an opportunity to see their child's work and still feel part of their learning journey and the school itself. As our valued partners in learning, we are always keen to welcome you to school and we value your feedback on these occasions.

World Book Day was a huge success as the school was sprinkled with magic and make believe! The classes all looked at Peter Pan, by J. M. Barrie after seeing the Pantomime at Christmas. Thanks to the P1/2 for organising and running another well-attended community café. It was such a pleasure to welcome so many families into school and see the buzz around the Book Swap – we have spare books in school, particularly novels that would suit older children (Lemony Snicket series, Roald Dahl titles, Diary of a Wimpy Kid etc) so if you are looking for reading books, please make an enquiry and you can help yourself! The café raised a sum of £128.86.



The term ended on a high as the P4-7 led two performances of The Jungle Book at Drumlithie Village Hall. Anyone watching could see what a huge amount of work went into preparing for the show – the costumes, the scenery, the music, the props as well as the actual learning of lyrics and lines. It all came together beautifully and every single pupil contributed to the show in such a meaningful and individual way according to their unique strengths and preferences. Once again, I'd like to thank the parents, teachers and PSAs for all their support of the children as they worked towards the performances and a special thanks to everyone who came and packed the hall to watch – what a great atmosphere! The show tickets and raffle raised a phenomenal £705.42.

Our football team trained all term and had their efforts rewarded when they took part very successfully in a game at Laurencekirk – not even the rain could keep their spirits down! It's great to see this opportunity for pupils to play and I'd like to thank Mr Tattersall for his commitment to running such a fun and inclusive club. Active Sports were also in full swing last term with Mrs Glennie running a lunch time club, giving pupils of all ages a chance to try their hand at multisports.

A group of four brave primary sevens attended the rotary quiz and came second! Thanks for representing Glenbervie and doing us proud!

The end of term saw the pupils, staff and parent volunteers venture into the mist and tackle the hill at the back of Drumlithie for our sponsored walk. We were just delighted by how well every single pupil managed despite it being a long way on a dreich day. The snack in the barn certainly lifted spirits for the return journey and I'd like to thank the farmer for accommodating us and being so supportive – it really made our day! The walk has raised £545.50 so far!




Looking forward

Staffing



School Improvement

This term we will continue to focus on strengthening our awareness of our school values. These values of Responsibility, Respect, Care, Honesty and Fairness give everyone in school a shared language that helps us learn successfully and play happily. We often refer to these values and this allows everyone to understand the school expectations. We are putting up a display at the front door that the P5/6 have designed with characters representing each value as a way of visually sharing what we are all about at Glenbervie.

In their classes, pupils will be exploring the Wellbeing Indicators from GIRFEC and what these actually mean in practical terms, breaking each indicator down and finding appropriate language to help the children express themselves clearly and engage in meaningful discussion around their wellbeing needs.

We remain committed to supporting writing and mental maths as areas for improvement.

Assemblies will be led by Mrs Reekie on a Friday and this term we will be looking at our weekly UNCRC right as well as fesitvals from Islam, Judaism and we are also hoping to look at our school aims and elements of cyber safety.

We were so pleased last term with the number and variety of achievements that were emailed in to the school – our Good News board looks fantastic!
