



GLENBERVIE PRIMARY CURRICULAR LETTER

Term 3 Primary 6/7

This curricular letter aims to share with you the key learning which your child will engage with this term.

This term P 6/7's topic will continue to be a series of short topics Exploring Europe (to support the Euroquiz) and My Body. Within the **Exploring Europe** topic we will learn about a variety of European countries. Ideal for developing their understanding of Europe, and the culturally diverse countries within it. We will study the human **body** and its different functions with our **My Body**, learning about organs and the brain.

We will be developing **Expressive Art Skills** through a **school show**, where the children will work collaboratively to bring alive all the elements of a performance. This will include singing, dancing, performing lines, the technical aspects and staging.

In Literacy, we will be focussing exploring 'The Write Stuff' to support our writing. Spelling patterns/concepts will be introduced at the beginning of the week, with a checkup on progress on a Friday. Weekly spelling homework will be issued through Sumdog. We will continue to encourage and develop fluency and expression when reading aloud, as well as develop inferencing and questioning. There will be a continued focus on handwriting and presentation of work across all jotters.

In Maths we will be learning about Fractions, decimals and percentages an would encourage supporting your children with these topics. We will be using a range of written and practical activities to continue to explore 2D and 3D shape. We will continue to challenge quick recall of the four operations through speed test, activities and games. Weekly homework tasks will be issued through Sumdog.

In Digital Technology, we will be continue learning about Just2Easy and begin using this to share our learning, as well as google classroom.
