



GLENBERVIE PRIMARY CURRICULAR LETTER

Term 2 Primary 6/7

This curricular letter aims to share with you the key learning which your child will engage with this term.

This term P 6/7's topic will continue to be Medieval Scotland and festivals. We will continue to look at the chronology of events, in particular, the Wars of Independence. This will be cross-curricular and aspects of these topics will filter into literacy, maths and design and technology.

We will be working **collaboratively** to present an assembly about **Remembrance Day**, using digital technology, **writing** and **communication** skills.

In Literacy, we will be focussing on **poetry** and the use of **descriptive language**. Spelling patterns/concepts will be introduced at the beginning of the week, with a checkup on progress on a Friday. Weekly spelling **homework** will be issued through **Sumdog**. We will continue to encourage and develop fluency and expression when reading aloud, as well as develop inferencing and questioning. There will be a continued focus on handwriting and presentation of work across all jotters.

In Maths we will be developing a range of strategies, both mental and written, using the **four operations** $(+, -, \times, \div)$. We will be using a range of written and practical activities to explore 2D and 3D shape and develop our knowledge of time, specifically **durations of time** and **reading timetables**. We will continue to challenge quick recall of multiplication and division facts through speed test, activities and games. Weekly **homework** tasks will be issued through **Sumdog**.

In Digital Technology, we will be learning about Just2Easy and begin using this to share our learning, as well as google classroom.
